- List of all registered charities
- Purpose of transparency
- Registration is voluntary
- Rich source of data about charities



Who would use the register?

- People who donate
- Members of charities or users of charities funds
- Other charities
- People who are applying for charities funds
- People thinking of starting up a charity
- Government
- Researchers
- Journalists
- The curious



What the register is not

- Being registered isn't a guarantee
- Check each charity carefully
- Donee status is on Inland Revenue's website
- The self reporting isn't always right
