## **Key websites mentioned in the webinar**

- Hāpai Hapori (Community Operations) is a branch within Te Tari Taiwhenua (Department of Internal Affairs or DIA). Community Operations advisors can help with accessing grants, community-led development and projects.
- → Matatika Mātauranga Kaitautoko (The Fundraising Institute of New Zealand or FINZ) is the professional body that represents fundraising in New Zealand.
- → Ngā Ratonga Kaupapa Atawhai (Charities Services) is part of DIA and administers the Charities Act 2005.
- To access any funding that DIA administers, you will need a RealMe account.
- → Community Matters is the central point of funding information for funders, individuals, organisations and communities.
- → Generosity NZ\_is the largest digital search facility for funding information in New Zealand that connects users to scholarships, grants, volunteering organisations and community groups.
- → DIA has information about gaming funding for community groups.
- Examples of funding options that are available for New Zealand charities and not-for-profit organisations are available on Charities Services' website.
- Charities Services has a blog post on How COVID-19 may affect your audit report.

## **COVID** specific funds mentioned in the webinar

→ The wage subsidy extension helps businesses affected by COVID and supports businesses and their staff to maintain employment. This is available for registered charities, incorporated societies and contractors.

- → The Ethnic Communities Development Fund has new priorities to support ethnic communities while they navigate the impacts of COVID.
- → Support for foodbanks, food rescue and other community food services are available through Te Manatū Whakahiato Ora (Ministry of Social Development or MSD).
- → Sport New Zealand Ihi Aotearoa provides financial relief to the support of sports and active recreation. Further funding sources can be found on its website.
- → COVID funding for services that provide support to women and girls has closed but information can be found here.

- → NZ Navigator is an online assessment tool that can help you focus on building strong and effective organisations.
