The Mixit Charitable Trust (CC47816) is a registered charity that offers a multi-ethnic creative platform for young people throughout Aotearoa providing programmes and workshops, based around dance, drama and music. They are working hard to increase the confidence, self-expression and communication of youth from refugee, migrant and local backgrounds. For these Mixers being involved in Mixit events creates new networks and opportunities, alongside life-long friendships. For many, their Mixit friends become whānau, where they support each other and develop a deep intercultural understanding of their peers.

In January 2023, 20 young people will come together with leading artists for a two-week intensive programme to create a performance from scratch. The theme is "HOME – It's where my heart is." While no previous skills are required, these Mixers will give their full commitment to create a joyous and celebratory series of performances.
