This is an example of changes planned to ensure the charitable sector is more transparent.

We will have an update about the extent of these financial reporting changes at our meeting in Auckland. An invitation to attend the annual meeting will make its way to you shortly. I look forward to talking with as many of you as possible.

I'd also like to take this opportunity to urge you to complete the bi-annual fraud survey that's undertaken by BDO, which provides a wealth of knowledge for the sector about strengths and weaknesses in preventing fraud. Just go to the link listed in the story below.

This bi-annual survey has acted as a valuable benchmark for not-for-profit organisations for a decade now, with the results providing insights into the perception and level of fraud in the sector. The BDO Not-For-Profit Fraud Survey assists the sector to carefully plan for future fraud prevention. The survey takes about 25 minutes to complete and will close on October 31, with the results collated and released in the New Year.

Make sure your organisation's fundraising appeal dates are included on the 2014 New Zealand Charity Appeal Calendar, coordinated by the Fundraising Institute of New Zealand (FINZ) (see the 2013 online calendar).

The calendar is used by councils throughout New Zealand to book street appeal sites and for scheduling other events. Inclusion is free to all charities: Submission deadline is 5pm, October 15.

Registered charities with large annual expenditure will be required to have their accounts either reviewed or audited from 2016.

Commerce Minister Hon Craig Foss and Minister Community and Voluntary Sector Hon Jo Goodhew announced recently that charities with annual expenditure of \$1 million or more will be required to have their financial statements audited by a qualified accountant, while those with an expenditure of between \$500,000 and \$1 million will need to have their financial statements reviewed by a qualified accountant. The changes do not affect charities with an expenditure of less than \$500,000, unless charity managers choose to introduce this measure.

Currently, all registered charities must file an Annual Return with the Department of Internal Affairs – Charities Services, and this will not change. Charities Services will provide more information for charities as details are finalised. In the meantime, you might like to read the information published on the

Survey draws strong response In July this year Charities Services sent a survey to all registered charities seeking their responses to a series of questions regarding organisational capability. The purpose of the survey was to gain a better understanding of the strengths and needs of charities, to inform us in our work.

Our thanks to the more than 4,600 charities who have completed the survey; your input has been invaluable. We hope to be able to share the survey results with you during November.

Part of our role at Charities Services is to support community organisations to build their governance and management capability. One of the ways we do this is by working with local capability builders such as council community advisors, arts and sports advisors, local Department of Internal Affairs community advisors, and community funders. The data from the survey will help us make sure that support is as relevant and valuable as possible.

In October groups can apply to receive a share of the \$1 million Z is distributing across the country next year. A total \$4000 per will be split between four local groups, according to the number of customer votes each successful group receives through on-site voting at that Z station in March 2014. Another \$1000 will be used by each Z station throughout the year to support other neighbourhood groups and causes.
